Presented as a three-dimensional panorama with music and narration, the painting of the Battle of Atlanta forever captures a pivotal moment in the history of our nation. You will experience the drama (while seated) of an absorbing human story that took place on a hot July day in 1864.

The Story Behind Stone Mountain

Stone Mountain was formed over 300 million years ago, long before dinosaurs roamed the earth. On the face of the mountain is the Memorial Carving, which depicts three important figures from the Civil War: President Jefferson Davis, General Robert E. Lee and Lt. General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson. The figures are surrounded by a carved surface that is bigger than the carving on Mount Rushmore. The project began in 1923 and encountered lengthy delays. It was finally finished more than 50 years later. The figure of Robert E. Lee stands as tall as a nine story building, and Jefferson Davis' thumb is the size of a sofa.

The sculpture measures 90' x 190'.

The carved area covers three acres, which is larger than a football field.

It is situated 400 ft. above the surrounding ground.

It is recessed 42' into the mountain.

The deepest point is at Lee's elbow, recessed 12' from the mountain's surface.

It is estimated that the granite extends up to seven miles below the ground and into parts of North Carolina. Granite mined from Stone Mountain was used in the foundation of the Georgia State Capitol building and for locks in the Panama Canal. Frank Lloyd Wright also used the granite to build the Imperial Hotel in Tokyo, Japan.

State of the Organization Address

To fellow King of the Road owners and members of the Kings on the Road Organization:

An issue that I thought had been put to rest for a few years was raised again at the Annual business meeting at Vidalia, LA. The issue concerns the membership qualifications for becoming a full voting member of the Organization.

At this time, the Organization is basically divided into two distinct groups. One group wants to change the membership qualifications and allow membership to any qualified RV owner regardless of the brand of RV they own. The other group wants to maintain the status quo and keep the Organization intact with only King owners as members and owners of other rigs as guests.

As you recall, in October, 2008, at the rally in South Dakota, a compromise was reached and the By-laws were amended to allow chapters to have Associate Members and allow the Associate Members to attend the National Rally as guests of the Chapter member. This year we had seven (7) guest rigs attending the rally and participating in all activities except for the business meeting.

As your President, it is my duty to remain neutral in matters brought before the Organization and I will make every effort to do so in this matter. However, as this is an issue in which emotions are running high, I feel I have a responsibility to ensure that all our members have as much information as possible in order to make an informed decision. Both groups have made very compelling arguments and believe strongly in their positions. In my opinion, neither group is entirely right nor entirely wrong.

At this point, I would like to present a few facts for your information:

1. **Financially** – Administratively, the Organization is very sound and for the foreseeable future there is no need to increase dues regardless of membership size.
2. **Membership decline** – in the year of 2000, we had a membership list of 630 rigs. From year 2000 until 2006, membership declined from 630 to 228. This appears to be a huge drop, but these earlier years were when the factory was in production and was paying for the first year's membership. Many of these new members never came to our rallies and never showed interest in continuing membership in this Organization. Since 2006 we have dropped to the most recent count of 124 rigs. This loss is more reflective of those that have quit traveling in RVs for health, age or financial reasons. Also included are former members who have switched to another brand of RV since they were unable, or preferred not to, purchase Kings.
3. **Rig Replacement** – Many of our current membership have rigs that are reaching the age of replacement. For the past three years there has been no new King of the Road RVs manufactured. However, there are one, and

possibly two, investment groups that have shown interest in purchasing Kings on the Road from Chief Industries. This is only a possibility, and may or may not ever occur.

4. **Rally Attendance** – The concern has been expressed that fewer members are attending the rallies due to the decline of membership. Percentage-wise, we have a greater number of members attending the national rallies than in previous years, before the closing of the factory. More attendees mean larger self-supporting rallies and the potential to increase vendor attendance. However, more attendees also limits the choice of RV parks able to accommodate us.

After the By-Law change made in 2008, some Chapters revised their by-laws to allow Associate Membership. This enabled those without Kings to join the chapters and also to attend the National KOTR Rally and participate in the activities. Staying in touch with the Organization and membership was very important to those who had previously owned a King. Some of these former members have voiced their aversion to belonging to an organization where they cannot be full-fledged members with all voting rights. This appears to be a major issue, and one we may have to decide in the near future.

Once the By-Laws are changed to allow members who own a brand of RV other than a King, we cannot be an exclusive King of the Road RV Organization and will not have the support of the factory should production ever continue. The use of the name and crown logo could possibly be forfeited.

Therefore, every member should determine the answer to one of the two basic questions in their decision making:

1. Is it best for the Kings on the Road Organization to move forward and change the membership qualifications now?
2. Is it best for the Kings on the Road Organization to trust our elected Board to closely monitor the situation and make the recommendation to change when they feel that waiting any longer would be detrimental to the organization.

The Organization is currently comprised of only King of the Road owners. To change this would require By-law changes as required in paragraph 18 & 19 of our Organization By-laws. These changes require a two-thirds majority of the membership at the rally and absentee ballots.

As your President, I sincerely hope that I have maintained a position of neutrality. I believe that all the elected Board members should represent the entire Organization and support the desires of the majority of membership in the direction they chose on this matter.

I trust that all members of the Kings on the Road will give careful thought and consideration to the direction you want the Organization to proceed.

Discovering Stone Mountain Museum features artifacts and stories that span 12,000 years, from ancient civilizations that lived on the mountain to the present-day park. Learn about Native Americans and pioneer settlers. See how the community was affected by the Civil War and how Stone Mountain granite helped build the local economy.

Antebellum Plantation & Farmyard – The Antebellum Plantation at Stone Mountain Park is a collection of original buildings from around the State of Georgia, built between 1783 and 1875. Each structure was moved from its original site and carefully restored to preserve its authenticity and historical value. The grounds include the plantation house, a working cookhouse and blacksmith shop featuring demonstrations of crafts, a peanut market, a doctor's cabin, slave cabins, a coach house, a school house, a smokehouse, and a four-seater 'necessary house.'

This fascinating area also houses the most extensive collection of period furniture and decorations in the south, reflecting the diverse lifestyles of 18th and 19th century Georgia residents.

Take a self-guided tour and enjoy the sights and smells of the working cookhouse and garden where demonstrators preserve the timeless culinary traditions of the south. 18 historically restored and decorated buildings bring to life an authentic, Southern plantation.

Scenic Railroad – A full-size locomotive from the 1940s with open-air cars takes guests on a lively, five-mile excursion around the mountain. Sing-a-long with railroad favorites as stories of Stone Mountain's past are narrated along the scenic journey. (Trip lasts 25-30 minutes. Train departs every 40-45 minutes. Visit the train depot for exact departure times.)

Summit Skyride – A high-speed Swiss cable car provides a dramatic view of the Confederate Memorial Carving as it transports guests more than 825 feet above the ground to the top of Stone Mountain

Ride the Ducks Sightseeing Adventure—*For an additional \$8.00 per person charge* – A unique amphibious sightseeing experience that takes visitors on a 20-minute tour throughout the Park, on land and in water. Ride along as your entertaining tour guide/comedian has you in stitches while you learn about the history of the Park in a rollicking, fun adventure. The first tour generally departs at 11:00 AM. Reservations are required.

Things To Do In the Park That Don't Require The Park Pass

Lasershow Spectacular – Saturday night.

The world's longest running laser show, projected on the face of the mountain, is an Atlanta tradition. Bring your blankets or lawn chairs and enjoy the 35 minute show of laser effects, lights and fireworks, all choreographed to a variety of popular musical favorites.

Confederate Hall—The first floor is dedicated to the geology of the mountain. The second floor is dedicated to the Confederacy. Very interesting!!

Quarry Exhibit – "Raising the Ledge" is an outdoor museum developed to tell the story of an industry and the quarrymen who played a monumental part in the history of the mountain

Covered Bridge – The 1892 pine and cedar bridge is 20 feet high and was moved to the Park in 1969 from Athens, GA, where it spanned the Oconee River.

Carillon Bells – As you're hiking the trail or cruising along on the paddlewheel boat, listen for the magical sounds of the Carillon Bells. The redwood and steel Carillon features 732 bell tones that play throughout the Park. It stands 13 stories tall and was built for the 1964 World's Fair in New York.

Grist Mill – This authentic, pewter-colored mill was built circa 1850 and moved to the Park from Lawrenceville, GA.

**Proposed Changes to The
Bylaws of Kings on the Road
Dated October 1, 2009**

Submitted by Betty Slater, Member No. 936

(Note: In the current paragraphs, the parts to be deleted are shown with a thick dash underline.)
(Note: Paragraphs 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, and 13 are unchanged.)

1. The name of this organization shall be Kings on the Road hereafter referred to as the Organization.

Current paragraph 2:

2. The Organization will be nonprofit and comprised of owners ~~of vehicles manufactured by King of the Road, a division of Chief Industries,~~ whose purpose is:

- A. To promote communications between owners, social interchange and a forum in which owners can share experiences, problems and solutions as they pertain to ~~King of the Road vehicles.~~
- B. ~~To provide a channel through which the owners and manufacturer can communicate and the manufacturer can provide product information to owners and receive feed-back which may assist in improving their product.~~

Proposed Change: 2. The organization will be nonprofit and comprised of owners of fully self-contained recreational vehicles with the exclusion of truck campers, pop-ups and tents, whose purpose is to promote communication between owners, social interchange and a forum in which owners can share experiences, problems and solutions as they pertain to individual recreational vehicles.

Proposed Change to Paragraph 2A: Delete (Added to Paragraph 2.)

Proposed Change to Paragraph 2B: Delete

3. Members present at the November 1995 Rally are designated FOUNDERS. All members who joined after this meeting and before December 1, 1996 are designated Charter Members.
4. Members shall be obligated to pay dues to cover the expenses of the Organization. A proposal to change the dues, the amount of the proposed change and the effective date, must be printed in the Newsletter prior to the annual business meeting. It shall be incumbent on the officers of the Organization to take all steps necessary to maintain adequate services without having to seek additional dues.
5. An additional cost per person will be assessed the first year of membership to cover the cost of the name badge[s].
6. The Organization will elect officers from within its ranks to serve for a period of two [2] years. Nominations will be accepted from the floor. Elections will be held during the annual meeting by paper ballot.

Election of officers will be offset as follows:

President	even numbered years
Vice President	odd numbered years
Secretary/Treasurer	odd numbered years
Membership Chair	even numbered years
Publicity Chair	even numbered years
Chapter Chair	odd numbered years

7. The terms of all elected officers begin with their introduction after their election at the annual meeting.

8. These six officers plus the Wagon Master constitute the Board. The seventh member of the Board is the Wagon Master of the rally who will be selected annually by the next host chapter. No member shall hold more than one office at a time. Elected officers may serve successive terms.
9. No member shall hold more than one office at a time. Elected officers may serve successive terms.
10. There shall be four standing positions of the Organization appointed by the President:
 - A. Historian
 - B. Parliamentarian
 - C. Web Site Manager
 - D. Chaplin

Current Paragraph 11:

11. A membership meeting will be held at least once each calendar year. This meeting will be held during the annual rally. Members in good standing and attendance will have the right to vote. For voting purposes, each King of the Road RV will constitute one membership and be accorded one vote.

Proposed Change to Paragraph 11: (Words underlined in this section are taken from paragraph 19.) A membership meeting will be held at least once each calendar year. The meeting will be held during the National annual rally. Members in good standing will have the right to vote. For voting purposes, each RV will constitute one membership and be accorded one vote. Except for administrative changes, any proposed amendment(s) to the Bylaws, as published in the newsletter issued preceeding the date of the annual meeting, requires a two-thirds majority of the votes counted at the National rally. A vote counted is defined as the votes of the members present at the rally and all absentee ballots received by a specified date as determined by the Board.

12. The Parliamentary authority of the Organization will be Robert's Rules of Order. The current revised edition will apply.

13. The site of the annual meeting and rally shall be determined by the Board. Every attempt will be made to schedule rally sites more than one year in advance.

Current Paragraph 14:

14. Local and/or state chapters will be authorized by the Executive Board. The Chapter Presidents or designated representatives will serve on the Chapter Committee of the Organization. All members of local and/or state chapters will be in good standing with the Organization.

a. Chapters may have Associate Members who are individuals that do not own King of the Road RV's or King of the Road owners who do not want to join the National Organization. The Chapter's bylaws will govern their Associate Members. However, under no circumstance will Associate Members be allowed to vote on any matters concerning the National Organization.

b. Chapters should use the following guidelines in accepting Associate Members:

1. Associate Members should be at least 21 years of age.
2. Associate Members should be owners of fully self-contained recreational vehicles with the exclusion of truck campers, pop-ups and tents.

Proposed Change to Paragraph 14: Local and/or state chapters will be authorized by the Executive Board. The Chapter President or designated representative will serve on the Chapter Committee of the Organization. Only Chapter members who belong to the National Organization will be allowed to attend National rallies and vote on any National matters.

Delete 14a (Proposed change to paragraph 2 removes any requirement for Associate members and also puts paragraph 14 back to basically the way it was before it was changed to allow associate members.

Delete 14b.

Current Paragraph 15:

15. Chapter Associate Members may attend the National rally as a guest of a Chapter Member. As a guest at the rally they may participate in all of the National rally activities except for the Business Meeting. This would include 50 - 50's, Brown Bag auctions, door prizes, vendor prizes, etc. Guests are not eligible to win the Rally Registration Gift Certificate. Guests may park with their sponsor.

Proposed Change to Paragraph 15: Delete 15.

Proposed Change: Renumber Paragraphs 16 through 18 as 15 through 17, and Paragraph 20 as 18.

16. 15. The colors of the Organization will be white, gold and maroon.

17. 16. The logo will be the King of the Road CrownÆ.

18. 17. The Publicity Chair shall receive bylaw amendments to be considered at the annual meeting. The Publicity Chair shall make editorial changes as needed and shall contact the sponsor if substantive changes are necessary for the proposed amendment[s] to be in proper order. The proposed amendment[s] and ballot(s) for absentee voters will be published in the Newsletter issue preceding the date of the meeting.

Current Paragraph 19:

19. Except for administrative changes, any proposed amendment(s) to the Bylaws, as published in the newsletter issued preceding the date of the annual meeting, requires a two thirds majority of the votes counted at the National rally. A vote counted is defined as the votes of the members present at the rally and all absentee ballots received by a specified date as determined by the Board. Any motion to amend the proposed amendment(s) made at the annual meeting will only require a two thirds majority of the members present and in good standing at the meeting.

Proposed change to Paragraph 19: - Delete (First two sentences added to paragraph 11. Last sentence deleted.)

20. 18. Administrative changes to the bylaws may be submitted at the annual membership meeting. Administrative changes are corrections to the wording, spelling or additions that do not change the basic intent of the bylaw. A two-thirds vote of the members present at the meeting shall be required for approval of the administrative changes.
