Rollin'...Rollin'...Rollin' on the River!!! Attractions in Vidalia, LA

We hope that you all plan to attend the KOTR 15th National Rally scheduled to be held in Vidalia, LA September 27th through October 4th, 2009. It will be a wonderful time. Along with the many exciting activities that have been planned during the Rally, there is also plenty of free time to go out on your own and explore what the area has to offer. Below are a few highlights of the local attractions that are in the area. The information was taken from the Chamber of Commerce web page located at www.seevidalia.com. There is more information at the website if you are interested, as well as for neighboring Natchez, MS, at www.natchezchamber.com.

Music Museum, Ferriday The Music Museum is located in Concordia Parish just minutes away from historic Natchez, MS. It is the home of entertainers Jerry Lee Lewis and Mickey Gilley, evangelist Jimmy Swaggart, blues trombonist Pee-wee Whittaker and newscaster Howard K Smith. See exhibits focusing on the history and culture of Louisiana's and Mississippi's Delta region music and visit the museum's Hall of Fame.

Frogmore Plantation Rand McNally's MUST SEE is COTTON THEN & NOW...a guided tour featuring extensive Southern history 1700's-today, an 1800 acre working cotton plantation, furnished slave cabins, a Smithsonian quality antique steam gin, 19 historical buildings, a new computerized gin & farming operation.

Natchez Indian Museum The 128-acre Grand Village site features a museum accredited by the American Association of Museums, a reconstructed Natchez Indian house, and three ceremonial mounds. Two of the mounds, the Great Sun's Mound and the Temple Mound, have been excavated and rebuilt to their original sizes and shapes. A religious structure once stood atop the Temple Mound and housed bones of previous chiefs (called Suns). A sacred perpetual fire was kept in the Temple's inner sanctum, symbolic of the sun, from which the royal family had descended.

A third mound, called the Abandoned Mound, has been only partially excavated. After three major archaeological excavations at the Grand Village by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, no more digging investigations are planned for the site. The unexcavated areas of the site will be preserved intact, representing a sort of "time capsule" from the Natchez Indians' past.

Jefferson College At Historic Jefferson College, the first educational institution of higher learning in Mississippi, visitors can tour a restored dormitory room, student dining room, kitchen buildings, and other historic sites. The adjacent nature trail winds up and down through a wooded ravine, past St. Catherine's Creek, over bridges, past Ellicott Springs, and a historic cemetery, with plants and trees clearly identified along the way. Admission is free.

National Park within the confines of the City of Natchez Currently it operates two sites, Melrose and The William Johnson House. Melrose is situated on 133 acres of live oak covered land. Over an eight year period, a combination of slave and free labor constructed the Greek-revival style mansion and the estate's out buildings. The completion of The William Johnson House in 2005 culminated three years of restoration to this important Natchez treasure. At age 11 William Johnson was emancipated by his master, also named William Johnson, joining his sister Adelia, and their mother Amy whom Johnson had freed earlier.

These are just a few highlights and we hope to see you all at Rally!

The 2009 Full Time Kings Rally will be held September 20 through 26, 2009, at the **Sun Roamers** RV Resort which is located in Southern Mississippi less than two miles off I-59 and within minutes of I-10 and Slidell, LA. This resort offers a relaxing atmosphere with gravel pads, full hookups with plenty of room for slide outs and big rigs, under the whispering pines with many amenities for all to enjoy. We encourage everyone to come and bring your friends to enjoy this resort and all the festivities.

AMENITIES include a welcome center, Olympic size pool, free wireless internet, fishing, Putt-Putt golf, horse shoes, Café & Clubhouse that will accommodate 250 people, with an exercise room, card and game room, bingo, music and TV. They have a chapel with a nondenominational service held every Sunday morning at 8:30 to 9:30 a.m.

Our dedicated and hardworking Wagon Masters, Earl and Cathy Canady, and their Assistant Wagon Masters, Ed and Bettye Perkins have organized many activities and tours to make this Rally a memorable event for everyone. If you've never been to Picayune, Mississippi, you don't want to miss this Rally.

Some of the highlights that we will all enjoy are:

a. **Slidell Museum:** The Slidell Museum is located in the old town jail. It houses two permanent collections. Downstairs is a collection of old photographs, items and memorabilia on the history of the city of Slidell. Upstairs is an extensive exhibit detailing the South's role in the War Between the States. The exhibit contains original reproductions of military uniforms with comprehensive text and audio displays. The museum also displays temporary exhibits from the local community.

b. **Mardi Gras World New Orleans:** This is the largest float designing and building facility in the world. More than 80 percent of the floats that journey down New Orleans' streets during the Carnival season are designed and built here. To get the feeling of Mardi Gras year-round, we must visit this place.

c. **New Orleans Steamboat NATCHEZ:** Two-hour cruise from the heart of the French Quarter takes us back when cotton was king and life was slow and graceful as the current on the Mighty Mississippi River. We will see New Orleans, one of the world's most active ports, as it can best be seen from the river aboard New Orleans' only authentic steamboat—The Steamboat NATCHEZ.

d. **Bay St Louis Historic Town Center:** Tour the historic town with 56 shops, galleries, and restaurants.

e. **NASA's John C. Stennis Space Center:** The world's largest rocket testing complex is located at this space center which is also the home to NASA's Applied Sciences Directorate. It also features a visitor center that includes motion simulator rides to Mars and Saturn, an International Space Station exhibit, a weather forecasting center, a restaurant, and a gift shop.

We will enjoy a Margarita Welcoming Party, catered Bar-B-Q meal, Hot Dogs with fixings, Casino buffet, Seafood dinner and Potluck dinner. There are also scheduled social hours with selling of 50/50 tickets, door prize drawings, and business meeting.
