

Y'all Come to Stone Mountain, Georgia For the 2010 National Rally !!

It is official! We will be going to Stone Mountain, Georgia, just east of Atlanta, October 10-17, 2010, for the next national rally.

Stone Mountain is a 3200 acre park and is Georgia's number one attraction. It is located 16 miles from downtown Atlanta with good interstate access. The park features:

- Spectacular Laser Show,
- Quarry Exhibit,
- Three-acre stone carving in the side of the mountain,
- Swiss cable car ride to the top of the mountain,
- Antebellum Plantation with farm yard, school display and displays of plantation life;
- 1940 era train ride,
- Miniature Golf,
- 4-D movie,
- Car Museum,
- Pumpkin Festival which features, a pie eating contest, pumpkin carving and hay rides.

Our 75 sites have full hookups, fire rings and tables. The park has three laundry mats, 24 hour fire, ambulance, EMT and security, and wireless internet at most sites.

The Host Chapters met at their November Rally and started the detailed planning. It got us EXCITED enough that six (6) rigs are going to Stone Mountain for five days in early December to narrow down the tours, entertainment, area restaurants and other facilities for the Rally.

Entertainment in a metropolitan area is very diverse and we hope to provide some really great times.

Available tours are World of Coca Cola, Underground Atlanta with 12 acres of stores located where troops moved underground during the Civil War, the largest aquarium in the world, Federal Reserve Bank, CNN World Center, Cyclorama, Stone Mountain Village, the world's largest Farmers' Market and Atlanta's mass-transportation system: Marta.

I guess you can see why we are excited about this Rally. Mark your calendars—we are going to have a great time!

From the Web Site Manager

In July of this year, I purchased a mobile "Hot Spot." Mine is made by Autonet and additional information can be found at www.autonet.com.

Although the initial outlay is a little steep (They are currently offering a \$200 rebate), the monthly rate of \$30 is very reasonable. This rate provides 1GB of transactions (approximately 2000 pictures) each month. They do have a much higher transaction rate for \$50 per month but the average individual is very seldom going to reach the 1GB limit.

Autonet uses the Verizon Wireless system for its connectivity. Thus, you can use the Autonet anywhere you can use your Verizon cell phone.

It is a DC unit which enables you to use it in the truck while going down the road or in the trailer with the DC plug or using an AC/DC adapter (available at Radio Shack.)

I am now in my fourth RV park that advertised Wi-Fi but it was not usable at my site. My Autonet saved the day. I am also able to use it for a Wi-Fi system while at home, thus making for a 365-day system.

Needless to say, I am an advocate for the system.

Bylaws of Kings on the Road
Effective Oct. 1, 2009

1. The name of this organization shall be Kings on the Road hereafter referred to as the Organization.
2. The Organization will be nonprofit and comprised of owners of vehicles manufactured by King of the Road, a division of Chief Industries, whose purpose is:
 - A. To promote communications between owners, social interchange and a forum in which owners can share experiences, problems and solutions as they pertain to King of the Road vehicles.
 - B. To provide a channel through which the owners and manufacturer can communicate and the manufacturer can provide product information to owners and receive feed-back which may assist in improving their product.
3. Members present at the November 1995 Rally are designated FOUNDERS. All members who joined after this meeting and before December 1, 1996 are designated Charter Members.
4. Members shall be obligated to pay dues to cover the expenses of the Organization. A proposal to change the dues, the amount of the proposed change and the effective date, must be printed in the Newsletter prior to the annual business meeting. It shall be incumbent on the officers of the Organization to take all steps necessary to maintain adequate services without having to seek additional dues.
5. An additional cost per person will be assessed the first year of membership to cover the cost of the name badge[s].
6. The Organization will elect officers from within its ranks to serve for a period of two [2] years. Nominations will be accepted from the floor. Elections will be held during the annual meeting by paper ballot.
Election of officers will be offset as follows:

President	even numbered years
Vice President	odd numbered years
Secretary/Treasurer	odd numbered years
Membership Chair	even numbered years
Publicity Chair	even numbered years
Chapter Chair	odd numbered years
7. The terms of all elected officers begin with their introduction after their election at the annual meeting.
8. These six officers plus the Wagon Master constitute the Board. The seventh member of the Board is the Wagon Master of the rally who will be selected annually by the next host chapter.
9. No member shall hold more than one office at a time. Elected officers may serve successive terms.
10. There shall be four standing positions of the Organization appointed by the President:
 - A. Historian
 - B. Parliamentarian
 - C. Web Site Manager
 - D. Chaplin
11. A membership meeting will be held at least once each calendar year. This meeting will be held during the annual rally. Members in good standing and attendance will have the right to vote. For voting purposes, each King of the Road RV will constitute one membership and be accorded one vote.
12. The Parliamentary authority of the Organization will be Robert's Rules of Order. The current revised edition will apply.
13. The site of the annual meeting and rally shall be determined by the Board. Every attempt will be made to schedule rally sites more than one year in advance.
14. Local and/or state chapters will be authorized by the Executive Board. The Chapter Presidents or designated representatives will serve on the Chapter Committee of the Organization. All members of local and/or state chapters will be in good standing with the Organization.
 - a. Chapters may have Associate Members who are individuals that do not own King of the Road RV's or King of the Road owners who do not want to join the National Organization. The Chapter's bylaws will govern their Associate Members. However, under no circumstance will Associate Members be allowed to vote on any matters concerning the National Organization.
 - b. Chapters should use the following guidelines in accepting Associate Members:
 1. Associate Members should be at least 21 years of age.
 2. Associate Members should be owners of fully self-contained recreational vehicles with the exclusion of truck campers, pop-ups and tents.
15. Chapter Associate Members may attend the National rally as a guest of a Chapter Member. As a guest at the rally they may participate in all of the National rally activities except for the Business Meeting. This would include 50 - 50's, Brown Bag auctions, door prizes, vendor prizes, etc. Guests are not eligible to win the Rally Registration Gift Certificate. Guests may park with their sponsor.
16. The colors of the Organization will be white, gold and maroon.
17. The logo will be the King of the Road CrownÆ.
18. The Publicity Chair shall receive bylaw amendments to be considered at the annual meeting. The Publicity Chair shall make editorial changes as needed and shall contact the sponsor if substantive changes are necessary for the proposed amendment[s] to be in proper order. The proposed amendment[s] and ballot(s) for absentee voters will be published in the Newsletter issue preceding the date of the meeting.
19. Except for administrative changes, any proposed amendment(s) to the Bylaws, as published in the newsletter issued preceding the date of the annual meeting, requires a two thirds majority of the votes counted at the National rally. A vote counted is defined as the votes of the members present at the rally and all absentee ballots received by a specified date as determined by the Board. Any motion to amend the proposed amendment(s) made at the annual meeting will only require a two thirds majority of the members present and in good standing at the meeting.
20. Administrative changes to the bylaws may be submitted at the annual membership meeting. Administrative changes are corrections to the wording, spelling or additions that do not change the basic intent of the bylaw. A two-thirds vote of the members present at the meeting shall be required for approval of the administrative changes.
